

The club is situated at the base of Ceannt Tower and is run voluntarily by workingclass people, and is , we are happy to say, doing very well despite some temporary set-

The Ceannt Club has been condemned by some people for remaining free of all local affiliations. we are independent because we see no sense in the various Councils etc. running around playing gallery men to the politicians.

We believe that the people of Ballymun want action the many problems of the Estate now, not in five years time

AND BASEMENTS

You don't have to think very hard to know what this title means. Most of the clubs in Ballymun are situated under Towers or blocks of flats. The people running these clubs have the best interests of the children at heart (we hope), but basements are not the healthiest of environments in which to bring together large numbers of children.

Our eventual aim is to have an independent club rooms situated within the Estate. To achieve this aim we require a plot of ground on which to build our club.

Would you like to help us to achieve our aims,? Needless to say the work is entirely

(it may even cost you a few bob now and then). On the other hand you will have the satisfaction not only of working with a wonderful group of boys and girls but also, and perhaps more important, you will be giving them am opportunity to do something constructive with their free time.

VANDALISM.

There are approx. 3,500 families living on this Estate most of them dont know each other very well yet they all have one thing in common, they all contribute one way or another toward the upkeep and the building of the schools.

For some perverted reason of theur own, somebody is going around breaking the windows after school hours.

There are some good people in this scheme who organised a form of recreation for school children on at least one afternoon per week in one of the huts on Silloge Rd. It has been wrecked recently by vandals the piano broken, the seats upended and slashed and as a result the children had to miss their little games for a week.

Wehave a new Police Station, full of Gardai, and I think it is about time we impressed upon them the necessity of sending one or two men to patrol the vicinity of the schools and recreation hall from at least eight p.m onwards to ensure that ourselves and our children will be inconvenienced no longer.

HOME ASSISTANCE

MANY PROPLE IN IRELAND DON'T KNOW THAT WHEN THEY ARE UNEM-PLOYED OR SICK AND HAVE NOT GOT ENOUGH INSURANCE STAMPS TO QUALIFY FOR UNEMPLOYMENT OR SICK BENEFIT, THAT THERE IS AN ALTERNATIVE SERVICE WHICH THEY CAN AVAIL OFT, HOME ASSISTANCE. THEY ARE NOT INFORMED OF THIS AS A MATTER OF COURSE, BUT IF THEY INSIST THAT THEY ARE STARVING OR IN DANGER OF DOING SO. THEN SOME SOCIAL WELFARE OFF ICIAL WILL GRUDGINGLY DIRECT THEM TO GO TO THEIR LOCAL HOME ASSISTANCE OFFICE, WHICH IN THE CASE OF BALLYMUN IS SITUATED IN THE LOCAL HEALTH CLINIC. IT IS RUN BY THE EASTERN HEALTH BOARD. AS THE VERY NAME SUGGESTS IT IS AN ANTIQUATED, DEGRAD-ING, HUMILIATING EXPERIENCE TO APPLY FOR HOME ASSISTANCE. FIRST OF ALL THERE IS NO PRIVACY ACCORDED TO THE APP-LICANT, THEY HAVE TO QUEUE UP IN THE CROWDED CORRIDOR OF THE CLINIC. PATIENTS WAITING TO SEE THEIR DOCTOR KNOW EXACTLY WHAT THEY ARE QUEUEING FOR, AND WHEN THEIR TURN EVENTUALLY COMES THEY HAVE TO PROVE THAT THEY ARE REALLY DESTITUTE- IN THE CASE OF A DESERTED WIFE SHE HAS TO PROVE THAT SHE HAS ENDEAVOURED TO GET HER HUS-BAND TO RETURN OR TO SUPPORT HER, PREFERABLY TO RETURN TO HER BECAUSE GOOD CHRISTIAN ORGANISATION THAT THEY ARE THEY BELIEVE IN THE SACRED-NESS OF FAMILY LIFE. SHOULD THEY DECIDE THAT YOU ARE AT PAULT FOR BEING DES-TITUTE, THEN THEY DON'T WANT TO KNOW. IN ONE CASE THAT I KNOW OF A MAN WAS OUT OF WORK FOR A WEEK BEFORE HE PUT HIS CARDS IN THE LABOUR EXCHANGE POSSIBLY HE THOUGHT HE WOULD GET ANOTHER JOB IMMEADIATELY WHEN HIS WIFE WENT TO THE THE HOME ASSISTANCE OFFICER HE TOLD HER IT WAS HER OWN PAULT THAT SHE WAS DESTITUTE AND SHE COULDN'T EXPECT THE RATEPAYERS OF DUBLIN TO SUPPORT HER. WITH TYPICAL ARROGANCE HE FORGOT THAT SHE TOO WAS A RATEPAYER WHEN THEY EVENTUALLY CONCEDE THAT SOMEONE IS IN DIRE NEED THEY WILL ISSUE THEM WITH A BE CASHED AT LIPTONS SUPER-MARKET. NOW THIS IS THE POINT OF ENTRY TO THE REAL DEGRAD-ATION. THE UNAWARE WALK INTO THE STORE, COLLECT THEIR MESSAGES AND QUEUE AT THE CHECK-OUT. WHEN THEIR TURN COMES THEY PRODUCE THEIR VOUCHER ONLY TO DISCOVER THEY ARE AT THE WRONG CHECK-OUT. THEY ARE SENT, BEWILDERED, TO STAND AT NO.I CHECK-OUT WHILE AN EXTRA ASSISTANT IS SENT TO TAKE CARE OF THEM, (AFTER ALL WE CAN'T HAVE OUR CASH CUSTO -ERS INCONVENIENCED BY THOSE WHO CAN'T PAY FOR THEIR OWN POOD). THE VOUCHER IS THEN KEPT BY LIPTONS AND EVERY DAY AFTER THAT THE PERSON HAS TO QUEUE AT NO.I CHECK-OUT UNTIL THEY ARE ATTENDED TO. OTHER CUSTOMERS MAY JOIN THE QUEUE

AND ARE TOLD, "NO CHECKING

OUT HERE, THIS IS ONLY FOR VOUCHERS?".

AT THIS STAGE EVERYONE IN THE SHOP, STAFF AND CUSTOMERS ALIKE ARE-AWARE THAT THE PERSON IS "ON ASSISTANCE". OF COURSE MESSRS. LIPTONS HAVE OTHER WAYS OF DISCRIMINATING AGAINST PEOPLE ON ASSISTANCE. YOU MAY NOT GET LESS THAN 50p. WORTH OF GROCERIES AT A TIME. IN OTHER WORDS, IF A PERSON SUDDENLY DISCOVERS THAT THEY NEED MORE MILK AFTER THEY HAVE DONE THEIR SHOPPING THERE IS NOTHING THEY CAN DO UNLESS THEY ARE PREPARED TO SPEND ANOTHER 50p. OF THEIR VOUCHER. IT DOBSN'T MATTER IF A CHILD HAS TO CRY ALL NIGHT BECAUSE THERE IS NO MILK TO PUT IN HIS BOTTLE BUT IF YOU ARE PAYING CASH YOU MAY GO IN THERE TEN TIMES A DAY TO BUY A BOX OF MATCHES. WHEN WILL LIPTONS PUT A NOTICE IN THE WINDOWS SAYING, "ONLY CUSTOMERS SPENDING 50p. OR MORE ALLOWED". OF COURSE ANYONE WHO HAS EVER BEEN A RECIPIENT OF HOME ASST. IS ONLY TOO WELL ACQUAINTED WITH THE FOREGOING FACTS. ANY-ONE WHO HAS NEVER EXPERIENCED IT- EITHER PERSONALLY OR AT SECOND HAND- WILL PROBABLY DOUBT THE VERACITY OF IT, BUT THEY CAN CHECK IT OUT FOR THEM-SELVES ANY DAY OF THE WEEK IN BALLYMUN. IN PAIRNESS, IT IS PROBABLY AS EMBARRASSING FOR MOST HOME ASSISTANCE OFFICERS AS IT IS FOR THE RECIPIENTS. I AM NOT GOING TO SUGGEST WAYS OF IMPROVING THE SYSTEM BECAUSE & IT IS BEYOND REFORM. IT IS A FESTERING SORE, BUT UNDUNTUNA-TELY IT IS ONLY PART OF A LARGER CANCER WHICH IS THE SICK SOCIETY WE LIVE IN. WHILE WORKING CLASS PROPLE ARE TREATED AS WAGE SLAVES AND PROFIT- MAKERS FOR OTHER PROFILE THIS SORT OF SITUATION WILL REMAIN WITH US. PERHAPS IF THE MIDDLE CLASS LIBERALS TOOK UP THE CUDGELS ON OUR BEHALF THE MEDICINE MIGHT BE A LITTLE MORE PALAT-ABLE, BUT THE BASIC SITUATION WOULD REMAIN THE SAME. NOT EVERYONE IS ABLE TO WORK AND THERE IS NOT ENOUGH WORK AVAI-LABLE FOR THOSE WHO ARE ABLE TO DO IT, BUT NO FAMILY SHOULD HAVE TO EXIST ON A DIET THAT IS NOT NUTRITIONALLY BALANCED WHETHER IT IS THROUGH OR UNEMPLOYMENT THAT THEY ARE NOT WORKING. IT IS ONLY WHEN POOD, CLOTHING, HOUSING, LIGHT, HEAT AND MEDICAL TREATMENT ARE CONSID-ERED BY SOCIETY TO BE NECESS-ITIES UNRELATED TO EARNING ABILITY; WHEN THE BASIC PRE-CEPT OF OUR SOCIETY IS, "TO EACH ACCORDING TO HIS NEEDS, FROM EACH ACCORDING TO HIS ABILITY" , THEN? , AND ONLY THEN WILL EACH HUMAN BEING HAVE THE

PENAL REFORM.

Sir

That the Ministry for Justice is extremely harsh and unduly restrictive-in fact grossly unfair- in its treatment of prisoners in Irish jails is amply demonstrated by the continuance of protests by citizens and prisoners alike, both inside and outside the prisons. Riots, hunger strikes, peace -ful sit-ins, pickets, etc, are ample proof this. To the sceptic however, the unwillingness of the Dept. of Justice to allow our Penal System become subject to public scrutiny by Press and T.V. must establish in their minds that something is disastrously wrong.

It is not my intention to set out in detail the atrocious conditions of prison life, diet, hygiene, working , parole, discipline recreation etc. and the physical and psychological effect these have on the victims of our Penal Sustem. For decades there has been a continuous flow of ink describing the almost Bastille conditions of our prison life. "Dungeons dark and deep" by Peadar Cowan, Pronnsias Mac Aongheesa, John Welly, the Hibernia, to name but a few who have contributed ti what every now and again became a topic of slight interest to the general public, but unfortuneately their efforts were in vain.

I myself have been in and out of jail since the fifties ? and can honestly say that conchanged - diet - since then. In fact overcrowding has incre- the passengers, especially the sewerage disimproved accor!

I feel sure that the present campaign for Penal Reform will not phase out like so many others in the past. As the man said, "the time is now". In of the predictions made by the Minister for Justice(ex) that misconduct - peaceful sit-ins by prisoners- will be met with increased discipline. What exact nature this discipline would take is anybodys guess. I could hazard a few myself but they would not be believed.

Obviously the quality and quantity of any attempt at Penal Reform is dependent on how much money is made available to support it. Just as obvious, the amount of support supplied ultimately lies with the people of Ireland (I hope )

It is in your hands to stop this extremely serious undermining of prisoners individual welfare and self respect.

are capable of picking up languages very quickly, auch quicker than adults, and as a result dont feel hindered when it comes to school subjects. This school will also have the advantage of having smaller classes than we have in the existing schools in Ballynum. This I see as a great advantage to the child who is a slow learner. In a smaller class he has a chance of getting the little bit of individual attention he requires, something impossible for a teacher to do with a class of forty or more. Incidentally, there are Irish classes run for adults on the Estate, in the Club Gaelach on Shangan Rd, under the third eight Storey block, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, ii.30 to 12.30 and 8.30 to 10. Should you wish to enrol a child or get further particulars about it, this could be the place to do so. Parents of children attending the school should take an active part in its affairs. Seeing that it is in a working class area and run by working class parents this could ensure that no snob value or anything elitist be attached to it, as can sometimes be the case with such schools.

There are many new tenants arriving on this Estate almost daily. Quite often they Quite often they arrive only to discover that their gas has not been connected or their light turned on, often

both gas and light are out of action.

Then too there are many established tenants who do not know where to go for advice when they need help with problems such as Hire Purchase agreements, Social Welfare entitlements, rent arrears or wrong assessment, and many other such problems.



THE BALLYMUN ESTATE TENANTS ASSOCIATION HAS, FOR THE PAST YEAR, BEEN INVOLVED IN THE N.A.T.O. NATIONAL RENT STRIKE. WITH THE ELECTION OF THE COALITION GOVERNMENT THIS STRIKE MAY WELL BE NEARING AN END, HOWEVER WE MUST WAIT AND SEE. THE RENT STRIKE, AS MOST TENANTS KNOW IS ABOUT MANY ISSUES. THESE INCLUDE, DIFFER-ENTIAL RENTS, HOUSE PURCHASE, TRANSFERS, FIXED RENT INCREASES AND RATES. THE MOST IMPORTANT ONE FOR

BALLYMUN IS DIFFERENTIAL RENTS. WE CAN BE FAIRLY CERTAIN THAT N.A.T.O. WILL GAIN SOME WORTH-WHILE CONCESSIONS ON THIS ISSUE. WHILE THE RENT STRIKE IS BY

NO MEANS AS STRONG IN BALLYMUN AS IT SHOULD BE, THERE IS NEVERTHELESS A STRONG MINORITY HOLDING THE FORT HERE. THESE PEOPLE, ALONG WITH MANY THOUSANDS THROUGHOUT DUBLIN AND THE REST OF IRELAND WILL HAVE WON THE BATTLE FOR THE

A LOT OF TENANTS WERE FRIGHTEN-ED INTO PAYING THEIR RENTS BY THE CORPORATION. TENANTS ON STRIKE SHOULD IGNORE THREATS AND WARNINGS BY DUBLIN CORPORA-TION OFFICIALS, AND WAIT FOR A DIR ECTIVE FROM N.A T.O. BEFORE PAYING ANY RENT. THERE ARE ON THE OTHER HAND SOME PEOPLE WHO, WHILE CONTINU-ALLY MOANING ABOUT HIGH RENTS ETC, CANNOT SEE THREE WAY TO DOING ANYTHING ABOUT IT. THEY WILL ALWAYS DEPEND ON SOMEONE ELSE TO FIGHT THEIR BATTLES FOR THEM.

THEY WILL OFTEN PROCLAIM THEM-SELVES TO BE GREAT TRADE UNION-ISTS, INDEED SOMETIMES ACTIVE WITHIN A TRADE UNION, AND OTHERS WE WILL FIND WITHIN THE RANKS OF THE LABOUR PARTY. THE B.E.T.A. HAVE OF COURSE BEEN INVOLVED IN MANY OTHER ACTIVITIES BESIDES THE RENT STRIKE, THERE WAS FOR INSTANCE THE SWIMMING FOOL AFFAIR. THERE IS NO NEED TO GO INTO DETAILS ABOUT THIS. MOST TENANTS ARE WE'L AWARE THAT HAD IT NOT BEEN FOR THE HARD WORK AND AGITATION BY B.E.T.A. AND SUPPORTERS IT WOULD NOT NOW BE UNDER CONSTRUCTION. (IT SHOULD BE COMPLETE ABOUT THE MIDDLE OF SUMMER). THIS WAS NO MEAN FEAT IN VIEW OF THE FACT THAT THEY CAME UP AGAINST OPPOSITION FROM ONE LOCAL GROUP. ACTUALLY IT WAS ONLY PART LOCAL AS A LOT OF ITS MEMBERS WERE NOT TENANTS OF BALLYMUN. I AM OF COURSE REFERRING TO A GROUP CALLING ITSELF 'THE CEN-TRAL COMMUNITY COUNCIL . THIS GROUP WANTED THE SWIMMING POOL BUILT ON A DIFFERENT SITE

BOUGHT OVER THEY WERE OBVIOUSLY BOUGHT OVER BY SOME OF THE TRADERS AND THE BALLYMUN DEVELOPEMENT CO WHO

TO WHERE IT IS.

WANTED IT AS A TEMPORARY CAR PARK, AND EVENTUALLY TO BUILD ON. WE CAN BE SURE IT WASN'T THE PEOPLE OF BALLYMUN THEY HAD IN MIND. IT WAS THEIR OWN POCKETS THEY WERE THINKING OF. HOWEVER, ALL OF THESE PEOPLE WERE EASILY SEEN THROUGH. THE PEOPLE GAVE THEM THEIR ANSWER, AND SO THE POOL IS BEING BUILT WHERE THE VAST MAJORITY OF TENANTS WANT IT. IT IS UP TO US ALL NOW TO SEE

THAT THE CHILDREN OF THIS ESTA+ TE ARE GIVEN PRIORITY IN THE USE OF THE POOL.

OLD FOLK

THERE ARE APPROX 150 OLD FOLKS LIVING IN BALLYMUN. MOST OF THEM ARE LIVING EITHER IN MAIS-ONETTES OR ON THE GROUND FLOOR OF THE EIGHT STOREY BLOCKS. THERE ARE A PEW SCATTERED THROUGHOUT THE TOWER BLOCKS. SETTLING DOWN IN THIS ESTATE IS FOR THEM MUCH MORE DIFFICULT THAN FOR THE YOUNGER FOLK. IN MANY CASES THE YOUNG MARRIED COUPLES ARE ONLY HERE FOR A SHORT WHILE, FOR THE OLD FOLK, THEYHAVE LITTLE CHOICE BUT TO STAY, AND IT MUST BE REMEMBERED THAT MOST OF THEM COME FROM AREAS THROUGHOUT THE CITY WHERE THEYHAVE LIVED MOST OF THEIR LIVES.

BALLYMUN THEN, IS NOT ONLY STR-ANGE TO THEM, BUT IN SOME CASES TOTALLY ALIEN TO THEIR WHOLE WAY OF LIFE. THEY SUDDENLY FIND THEMSELVES WITHOUT THE FRIENDS AND NEIGHBOURS THEY HAD KNOWN ALL THEIR LIVES, VERY OFTEN ST-RUGGLING HARD TO MAKE ENDS MEET. FOR A NOMINAL CHARGE THEY CAN HAVE DINNER TWICE A WEEK IN THE PRE-FABS ON SILLOGE RD. THIS IS A VOLUNTARY SERVICE BY A NUMBER OF WOMEN, SOME OF WHOM DONT LIVE IN BALLYMUN.

THE LADY IN CHARGE IS A MIRS SINGLETON WHO LIVES ON SILLOGE RD . THESE PEOPLE GIVE A LOT OF THEIR TIME TO HELPING THE OLD

THE TENANTS ASSOCATION HAS PLAYED ITS PART, LIMITED AS IT IS, IN TRYING TO BRING SOME HAPPINESS TO OUR SENIOR CITIZENS: THE MOST RECENT EVENT BEING THE OLD FOLKS CHRISTMAS PARTY.

FUL OCCASION, AND ALL PRESENT HAD A VERY ENJOYABLE EVENING. THE WHOLE THING (DINNER INCLUD-ED) WAS HELD IN THE UPSTAIRS LOUNGE OF THE TOWERS PUBLIC HOUSE. THERE WAS LOTS OF POOD, DRINK AND ENTERTAINMENT. THERE FREE, INCLUDING COMMEDIAN JOHN MOLLOY. THE M.C. FOR THE NIGHT WAS MR BILLY CAMPBELL OF SHANGAN GDNS. LOTS OF TENANTS HELPED OUT WITH SERVING MEALS, AND THOSE WITH CARS DROVE THE OLD FOLKS HOME WHEN ALL WAS OVER. 





## HEERY • CRONIN • BOYLE

#### the three musketeers

According to the Peter Principle neople are promoted to their level of incompetence. In other words.acood policeman is made a sergeant, should he prove to be a bad sergeant he will remain one until he retires On the other hand, should he turn out to be a very successful sergeant he goes a step higher until eventually he is promoted to the job he can't do. At that point he stops.

There are obvious exceptions to this rule but none as obvious as the three people listed above Mr. Heery, who is Chief Eviction Officer for Dublin Corporation. Mr. Gronin who is in charge of the E.S.B. office in Finglas, and last but not least, Mr Bovle who was sent to Ballymun to prove a theory long cherished by that body; that you can in fact squeeze blood from a stone.

Before proceeding further let me make it quite clear that Iam not accusing these men of being in any way incompetent at their jobs, quite the reverse in fact; if for instance, the Corporation Official whose job it is to put people in houses showed half the enthusiasm that Mr. Heery shows in putting people out- why then, nobody in this City would be homeless. The same can be said of the other two. Mr. Cronin has knocked off more lights in Ballymun than Hitler did in Europe; Mr. Boyle is attempting, singlehanded, to reduce the debt of almost £IOOm. his employers owe to the America -n Banks.

Reluctantly then I must criticise Messers. Heery, Boyle and Cronin, not for doing their jobs badly, but for doing them too bloodly well. Lets examine them

one by one, beginning with

Mr. Heery.

I have actually come across a case where Mr. Fox, who is Heerys superior in the hierarchial structure of Dublin Corporation, was willing to make a settlement with a tenant due for eviction. Before doing so he had to ask for Mr. Heerys advice Mr. Heery said no and the tenant was duly evicted. Those present when Mr. Heery arrived to carry out the eviction swear that he smiled while doing so, obviously to show that he had no hard feelings. If this is true it shows the magnaminity of the man But even if he laughed his head off while the furniture was being put outside the door it would not alter the favt that a man, a woman and their children were being thrown out of their home and he was the man doing the

In terms of job satisfaction Mr. Heery is a contented man; he is a square peg in a square hole. One might even say of him that he has made a hobby of his work. Yet I can't help windering what he thinks of when he is not out riding to the badlands of Ballymun with the Sheriffs posse. when he is sitting down having a quiet pint or sticking stamps in his stamp album does he ever recall the frightened faces of the many women and children he has evicted? Does he ever tremble at the thought of the many husbands and fathers he has given cause to hate his very guts

And so to Mr. Cronin! What can you say about a man who would owe the E.S.B. five pounds? You could perhaps wish he had been in charge of the Cabra Branch when the Gardai in that area were allowed to run up a bill of over £200 before they were disconnected. And you might be very wrong. Perhaps Mr. Cronin is a realist; perhaps he accepts the fundamental dictum of our Society - "Do unto others if byou are sure that they can't do likewise unto you." After all an E.S.B. official who would stick his neck out so far as to cut off a policemans light couldn't expect much help from the Guardai if he was found drunk while driving. 

The headline to our article refers to a remark made by Dr. David Thornley at a recent meeting held in the upstairs lounge of the Towers

Dr. Thornley was critical of the manner in which politicians were paraded in front of the people two weeks before an election to make the usual promises. Read an account of the meeting and decide for yourself.

In the chair when the meeting opened was a Sergeant from the local station. On his right a member of the Community Assoc. and on his left an unidentified man. A very efficient looking secretary sat to the rear of the "Committee taking notes.

After a brief opening preamble, during which the Chairman explained that the meeting had been called to bring together all the people concerned with sport on the Estate, he invited the Dublin Corporation official present- a Mr. Byrne of the "Environmental Section" to present the case for the Corporation to the meeting. Mr. Byrne then mentioned the improvements the Corporation had brought about, all weather football pitches. He said that the plans for Ballymun were very much (up in the air) Dublin Corporation was at present involved in a Court ac action concering compulsory purchase of land, on the Es-tate. They had won the case but the landlord was appealing. Apwever there were plans in the pipeline to produce a 1 million sports complex he wasnt willing to say where- but it wouldn't be very far from Ballymun. (It is in fact Santry Stadium). Mr. Byrne also said that the swimming pool will not be completed until next Oct. In reply to questions from the floor as to hew many children the proposed sports comples would accomodate Mr. Byrne said that the D.C. had found in other areas that no more than 20% at the very most of youth in any area made use of sports facilities. A member of B.E.T.A. said that for once we were in agreement with Dublin Corporation. While the B.E.T.A. recognised and would fight for the provision of sports facilities they would hate to see the Corporation let off the hook by providing a few pavillions. What the B.E.T.A. sought was a proper Community Centre, one that all sections of the community could use from the Old age Pensioner down to the play The floor was group infants. then thrown open to those present and some very remarkable comments were made by Social Workers, Teachers, Priests, T.D.s Sportsmen, etc.etc. Unfortunately

tenants were conspicious by their absence. Quite a number of those present attacked the parents of Ballymun for their apathy. When the writer of this report pointed out that those same parents had not been informed that the meeting was even taking place nobody thought

it of any great importance.
Apart from Dr. Thornleys joke the howler of the night came from Murse Roberts of Eastern Regional Health Board. She said that single bedroom flats would make ideal playgroups for children and the way to go about getting them would be to evict the many people who were abusing them and would not pay rent. The Eastern Regional Health Board certainly allows its nurses

lots of scope. The Ballymun News has enough confidence in the decency in the tenants of this Estate not to believe for one moment that they would like to see a family thrown out of their home to provide playgroups-much as we need them. By all accounts Nurse Roberts is an excellent nurse. She should stick to her last and leave evictions to Mr. Heery.

As the evening wore on it became painfully clear that aal these people making plans for the future of our children had failed to do one elementary thing, they had failed to ask our permission or even to invite us to their meeting. And while it must be recognis -ed that the people of Bally-mun need all the assistance they can get , the people offering help must in turn appreciate that the parents are not complete fools., that they thrmselves have ideas as to what facilities their children need and how best to go about getting them. If this fact was accepted we could all work in harmony.

# SCHOOL the facts? what are MEALS

Children attending schools within the area controlled by Dublin Corporation are entitled to free school meals, you live in a flat or house in Ballymun, you pay your rent and rates to the Corporation, yet your children are not entitled to school meals. Why?

The reason for this very stupid situation goes back to the very beginning of Ballymun. The land on which the scheme is built is within the Co. Council area, and though everybody knows that both the Council and the Corporation are controlled by the same Dept of Government, (Local Government), yet both of these bodies had to reach an agreement as to who would be responsible for collecting rents, sweeping the roads etc. etc.

There are many different versions of this agreement, suffice it to say that the formula eventually worked out resulted in the majority of tenants paying rent and rates to Dublin Corporation yet being judged as living in the Co. Council area. This in turn means that the children of the Estate are disqualified from receiving free school meals.

Now since school meals are paid for out of the rates paid to Dublin Corporation, and since you pay those rates, even a fool would see the blatant injustice of this. The previous Minister for Local Government was fond of acting the fool when it came to dealing with the problems of Ballymun. Just consider some of his replies when asked about providing school meals

"I have no power to make such an order. The legislation governing these schemes empowers County Borough Councils, Urban District Councils, and Town Commissioners to arrange for the provision of meals in their areas. The schools in the Ballymun Estate lie outside the Dublin Corporation area and

Charlie has a reputation for never saying the wrong thing but in this instance he couldn't be more wrong. Theres a lot more can and will be done. For a start, Charlies party

no longer makes the decisions. We have a new Minister for Local Government, James Tully, and very soon he is going to be faced with the job of re- drawing the electoral boundaries. If every parent in Ballymun puts pen to paper and tells Mr. Tully that as a Labour Minister in a Coalition Covernment he should see to it that Ballymun- all of Ballymun- is brought within the Dublin Corporation area and that the children of the Estate, so long discriminated against, be given the school meals to which they are entitled and for which their parents pay. We might also remind Mr. Tully that it would be in the interests of any party claiming to represent the working class to ensure that the people of Ballymun be allowed to vote in one constituency, not three as is the case at present.
