

## ANTI-EVICTION MARCH

SATURDAY 10TH MAY 12.30PM DUNVILLE PARK TO CITY HALL

















The North is experiencing an unprecedented housing crisis, where private rents are over £1,100 in Belfast, more than 48,000 families are waiting for a social home and rates of social housebuilding are at a 60-year low.

But private landlords are allowed to evict tenants at will - including as retaliation for asking for basic repairs or challenging (or even questioning) rent increases. Loss of private rented accommodation is consistently among the top reasons for people presenting as homeless to the Housing Executive.

The largest landlord in the North, the Housing Executive, is denying its own tenants the right to succeed the tenancy on their family home. This is a desperate attempt to claw back social housing stock, in the absence of action on derelict homes and a persistent failure to build enough social homes where they're needed.

It's more important than ever that people have security of tenure - that they have safe, secure tenancies that enable them to raise their families, access local services and develop community networks and solidarity.

Evictions displace families and destabilise communities.

Join us on the 10<sup>th</sup> of May to take a stand against evictions and demand safe, secure homes for all!
