A Chara,

There should be no need for us to emphasise the seriousness of the present situation in the 6 Counties. Hundreds of people have been interned and innocent people are being murdered in the streets by the British Army.

There is a need for a massive response from the people of the Twenty-Six Counties. So far the response from even our own members has been poor. If WE betray the people of the Six Counties they will have no one. What are you doing about it? What can you do to support the people of the Six Counties -

- 1) All members who are free next week should report to the office from 10. 30.a.m. each day for centre city collections and paper sales.
- 2) Each cumann should organise 'pub and church-gate collections in their local areas. Where possible public meetings should be organised at churches or shopping centres. The Comhairle Ceantair are willing to arrange at least one speaker for each meeting.
- 3) Posters and leaflets calling for a boycott of British goods are available FROM THE OFFICE FOR DISTRIBUTION in each cumann area.
- 4) The Committee to Oppose Repressive Legislation are organising a picket on the Senate (Leinster House) on Wednesday next, Aug. 18th from 2-5.p.m. One of the effective ways in which you can fight repression in the north is by fighting repressive legislation in the south. All members who are available should support this pickit.
- 5) The August General Members Meeting will be held in the office next Wednesday at 8.00.p.m. It is essential that all members should attend. Aspeaker from the Movement in the north will be present to give an up to date analysis of the situation in the Six Counties.
