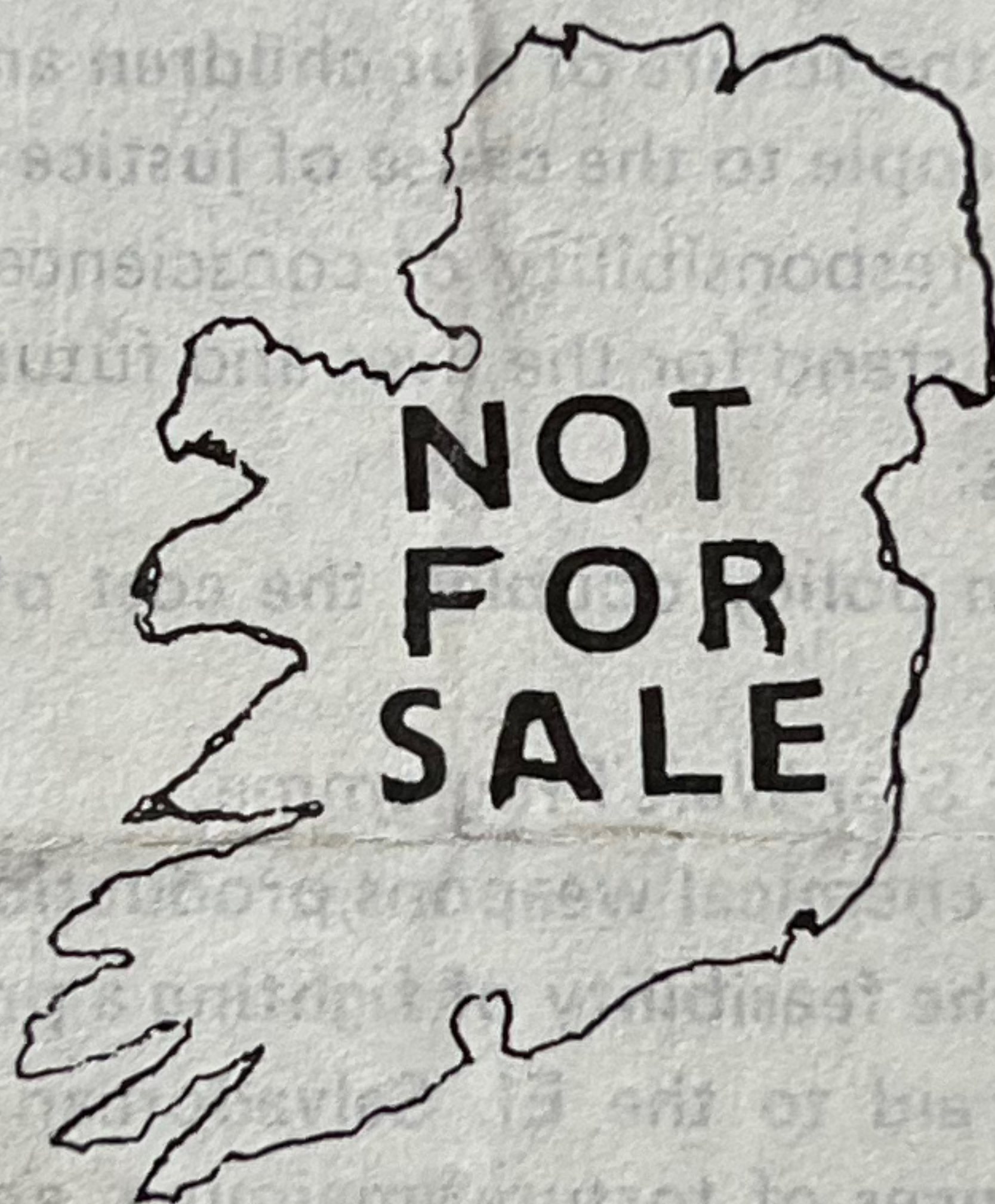

## **WHY WE ARE MARCHING**

Mr. Reagan is coming to our country next week. He comes not only as the leader of the world's most powerful country, but as a candidate for re-election to the world's most powerful and influential position.

## **DO YOU WANT HIM BACK?**

Ireland has always championed the right to the self determination of all nations and claimed her right to an independent foreign policy. As citizens of a neutral country and as citizens of the world, we have a responsibility now to express non-violently and effectively our deep concern for justice and peace. We must demonstrate to Mr. Reagan. That:

- The Irish people reject bullets, missiles and nuclear weapons as tools of diplomacy.
- We as a nation care about the millions of our fellow human beings who cannot march and who are suffering from repressive, dictatorial and murderous regimes.
- We are concerned about the future of our children and our earth.
- We are committed as a people to the cause of justice and peace.

This is our chance. We have a responsibility of conscience not to be silent. Join us in our peaceful march and make your stand for the lives and futures of us all.

While in power Mr. Reagan has:

- \* In four years of his foreign policy doubled the cost of the arms race which has very much changed the world.
- \* Initiated a 22 billion dollar Star Wars Programme.
- \* Broken a 14 year freeze on chemical weapons production.
- \* Commissioned a study on the feasibility of fighting a protracted nuclear war in Europe
- \* Greatly increased military aid to the El. Salvadorean junta — 126 million dollars in 1984 despite daily occurrences of torture, maiming, and disappearances. 40,000 have been killed in the last 4 years.
- \* Has waged undeclared war on the popular government of Nicaragua.
- \* Has defied international law and his own Senate and mined the vilian harbours of Nicaragua.
- \* Has continued financial assistance to Guatemala/El Salvador despite the human rights violations and atrocities committed by the government there.
- \* Has increased military aid to the tune of 900 million dollars to the dictator Marcos whose repressive regime is guilty of the murder of thousands and who at present is charging Fr. N. O'Brien and 8 others with murder.
- \* Has advocated "constructive engagement" and friendship with white minority rulers in S. Africa guilty of apartheid, a crime against humanity.
