There are over 180,000 vacant properties SINGIERG across the country, while over 11,000 are homeless. Irish property is dominated by corporate landlords – vulture funds – that speculate on it to turn a profit. The interests of the people – our right to adequate housing – are ignored, left at the whim of profiteering vultures. Young people are unable to leave home or they're forced into inadequate housing at extortionate rates. We refuse to sit idly by while another generation is ruined by this destructive system. A struggle must be waged to change this.

In order to tackle the housing crisis the RHL is organising the Irish people to take housing back under our control, rejecting the system that has neglected us. We need to build a mass campaign of housing resistance across the thirty-two counties, challenging those who cause and profit from the housing crisis; mobilising and organising the people to oppose it. We base our authority on the people of Ireland in opposition to the rotten system imposed on this nation through brutal colonisation. We acquisition vacant, unused buildings as it is a legitimate action to take - not a criminal one - and the vast majority of Ireland's people instinctively recognise this.

We remain true to the Irish Republic's Democratic Programme of 1919 which declared, 'all right to private property must be subordinated to the public right and welfare.' This is not the case today, when the right to hoard property holds more weight than any other right. In the interests of all the people in Ireland, this must be overturned.
