Ten years ago, we won marriage equality and the Gender Recognition Act. Tireless campaigning, activism, and direct action led to Ireland being the first country to legalize same-sex marriage through a popular vote. Ten years later, we are seeing a sustained attack on trans rights.

Recently the UK Supreme Court ruled that 'woman' under the Equality Act 2010 only refers to cisgender women and 'sex' is binary. This has severe consequences designed to marginalise the trans community from public life. Donald Trump announced executive orders that define gender as binary and tied to a person's biological sex, excluding trans people. Puberty blockers has been banned in the North of Ireland, with all executive parties voting in favor of the ban.

In Ireland, the waiting list for the National Gender Service has reached 13 years! The right-wing Programme for Government has removed commitments to non-binary and under 16's gender recognition, and failed to introduce a model of care based on the World Professional Association for Transgender Health.

We have to make Trans and Intersex Pride Dublin 2025 the biggest it's ever been! It's never been more important for us to organize and march against transphobia and the far-right. We must return Pride to its radical roots. We are explicitly anti-capitalist and march in solidarity with all oppressed people, particularly Palestinians, who are facing genocide and occupation.

No Pride for some without liberation for all. The far-right is attempting to crush the gains we've made, but we need to say clearly: We've come so far, we're not going back!
