Repeal not Replace

After the pro-choice conclusions of the Citizens' Assembly, Leo Varadkar has announced that a referendum on the 8th amendment will take place in 2018. We need to keep the pressure on the government to hold a referendum that offers us the opportunity to take abortion out of the constitution completely – straightforward repeal of the 8th, not replacement with another restrictive amendment.

Free Safe Legal Accessible

If and when the 8th amendment is repealed we will still have to fight for pro-choice legislation. In 2016 over 3,400 women travelled abroad from Ireland to access abortion. Many more women in Ireland procure abortions through abortion pills like mifepristone and misoprostol. Abortion in Ireland is a reality – we need to make it free, safe, legal and accessible.

Separate Church and State - Build a Secular Republic

The Workers' Party was the only party in the Dáil to oppose the introduction of the eighth amendment in 1983. We have long advocated the separation of church and state in Ireland and the building of a secular republic. We believe that the state must take ownership and control of our health and education through a process of compulsory divestment, and create publicly-owned, universal, secular health and education systems.

The Workers' Party played a key role in the opposition earlier this year to the new National Maternity Hospital being controlled by the Sisters of Charity. Workers' Party Dublin City Councillor Éilis Ryan organised the protest (pictured below) at the Department of Health in opposition to the decision.

The Workers' Party stands for:

- Repeal the 8th amendment
- Legislate for free and safe abortion and post-abortion care in Ireland
- Free access to contraception
- Support for women and men who do choose to have children, including free and quality childcare, and adequate support for lone and low-income parents.
- Secular public health and education systems funded properly through progressive taxation
- Introduce evidence-based sex education in all schools
- A new secular constitution
